School Day Field Trips

- Offered 850 field trips to our partner schools.
- Saw 12,000 students from 60 elementary, middle and high schools.
- Prioritized our reach to Title-1 schools where over 50% of the students qualify for free or reduced lunch programs.
- Most of our school day field trips are free or heavily subsidized by grants.
- Field trip programs: 90 minutes hands-on science experiences aligned with K-12 science standards and unstructured exploration.

After School Programs

- We partnered with 18 community organizations, including YMCA, Boys & Girls Clubs, Mission Graduates, Mission Girls, Tenderloin Community Center, and more, to bring over 100 programs across 9 different SF districts.
- Students built robots, motorized boats or wooden toys from scratch, and learned wood shop, soldering, circuitry and other skills, while exploring our geology and skeleton collections, exhibits and animals.

- Students learn about their circulatory system, anatomy and health while also engaging in hands-on activities.
